- 1) (5 min)- Framing: Mission, Members Present, Agenda Overview, Working Agreements,
- 2) (20 min) - SPF - Update from SPF Deep Dive Committee
 - a) Areas of strength: Green overall, green in growth, increase in SPED, increase in overall growth, Blue in math growth, ELLS - literacy, Strengths in early literacy and moving ss out of SBGL and BGL up a band
 - b) Areas for improvement: Not enough ss meets or exceeds - status, MGP in reading - average growth, ACCESS, writing about reading, literacy growth, student communication, Role-models, ELD throughout the day
- 3) (20 min) - CSC/SLT Side-By-Side - The Role of the CSC. Collaborate to adopt Handbook for CSC.
 - a) 2018-19 CSC side-by-side and 2018-19 handbook - the CSC reviewed both documents.
 - b) Change to 2018-19 Bylaws: The CSC voted through secret ballot to unanimously adopt the 2018-19 bylaws provided, with the change to part 4 decision making process - part B will now read: If the csc is not able to reach a decision by consensus, the instructional superintendent will collaborate with the CSC in person to make an impasse decision, in Collaboration with the CSC in a timely fashion.
- 4) (15 min) - Parent Engagement and Advocacy
 - a) Upcoming Events/Parent Nights
 - Literacy night - Community Resources, a non-profit that partners with DPS, will be putting it on (childcare, free food); first Thursday after Thanksgiving break - 11/29/18

- Diversity Club - Diversity Night May 23rd, with Mariachi and African Drumming - the club's first meeting is November 13 and initially be on Tuesdays only. Diversity performance for students 1:15PM Friday May 24th.
- b) Parent Advocacy Efforts
 - Asking for an ECE center program with 7-8 classrooms - Mrs. Garcia continuing to speak at Board meetings
- 5) (20 min) - Vote on Bond Priorities for Building Improvements. The CSC discussed different priorities, including a teacher survey of teachers wanting ceiling-mounted projectors in their classrooms. The CSC unanimously voted on the following items to be purchased through these bond funds:
 - a) Scenario 1:
 - \$25,000 - Classroom projectors
 - \$25,000 - Visual and Sound for Auditorium
 - \$18,000 - 2 Chromebook Carts - to replace older sets in classrooms of tested grades, with the sets that these will replace going (1) to the arts rotation teachers and (2) to the library/tech teacher as a standalone set.
 - \$12,000 - 200 Additional Chairs - uniform, in-good-shape chairs
 - \$15,000 - Curtains and Carpet for Auditorium
 - \$16,000 - Digital Marquis - at corner of Bolling/Dillon

- 6) (15 min) - Personnel Committee Update: Hired for .5 SPED and 1.0 ELA-S (½ of position is SPED, ½ is teaching 3rd grade in the opening that was needed). Still hiring for 1.0 SPED - finalist identified.
